2018 Elementary School Course Selections for Summer School

Advanced Art: (grades 5-7) Advanced Arts will give you the opportunity to explore the creative design of two and three-dimensional forms. From tessellations to sculpture you will have the opportunity to experience the elements and principles of design through extensive projects.
1 hour class. \$10.00 fee (Offered 2nd and 3rd Hour)

Archery: (grades 4-7) Students will learn the components of the bow and arrow. They will learn the protocols of shooting safely and have a chance to play a variety of games while target shooting.
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 1st and 2nd)

Artist's Studio: (grade 5-7) It's an open studio, a makerspace! Studio centers allow for independent exploration and discovery. From cardboard construction, to drawing, painting or paper art, the choice is up to each creative artist.
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 4th Hour)

Basketball Fundamentals and Skills I: (grades 1- 4) This course introduces the fundamental skills of basketball. Emphasis will be placed on training, rules and skill development.
1 hour class. No fee (Offered 1st hour)

Basketball Shooting: (grades 5-7) Class focus will be to improve your basketball shooting form. The class will include before and after video of your shooting form and drills the player can use to make the shooting changes permanent.
1 hour class. No fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Camp Read-a-Lot: (grades 5K-2nd) Grab your marshmallows, chocolate, graham crackers, books and sleeping bags because it's time for CAMPING! Come enjoy all the wonderful times of camping, picnics and the great outdoors through books, activities, cooking and much more.
1 hour class. \$2.00 fee (Offered 1st and 2nd hour)

Coding Class: (grades 2-5) This is a coding class that will blend online, self-guided, and self-paced tutorials with "unplugged" activities that require no computer at all! Students will learn: conditionals, algorithms, binary code, debugging, and societal impacts of computing.
1 hour class. \$2.00 fee (Offered 3rd Hour)

Cooking 1: (grades 5K-4) Students will learn the preparation of snacks and simple foods.
1 hour class. \$13.00 fee (Offered 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th)

Discover Clay 1: (grades 2-5) Discover a love for clay with this beginner's class to clay hand-building. Students will create their own artist's signature stamp, experiment with different textures on clay pinch pots, and create a slab mug and a coiled bowl. (Advanced students are also welcome into this session to develop their own ideas and inspire beginner students).
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Kindergarten Readiness: (grade K4) This course is designed to enrich the students' readiness for entry into 5 year-old Kindergarten. Students will explore math, literacy, and writing with summer themed arts and creativity. Students will learn and review phonics as well as enjoy interactive play with their peers.
4 hour class. \$8.00 fee

LEGO Learning: (grades 5K - 2) This course is designed for children who love to build with LEGO bricks. Students gain skills by following instructions and also being creative while building. Everyone will have an opportunity to share their creations with the entire class. We will use our imagination and plan. We work in groups, and even build with patterns throughout the course.
1 hour class. \$5.00 fee (Offered 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Hour)

Let's Get Active: (grades 5K-2) Playing creatively with a partner, or a group, is what participants of this class will be engaged in. Students will learn many new and creative ways to play games that involve exercising bodies as well as imaginations. Some examples of activities include: Outrageous Obstacle Course, Baggyball, Roll out the Marble, Sea Urchin Soccer, Under-the-Sea Tag, Sponge Brigade and more.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Machine and Things! NEW: (grades 3-7) Students will understand and create simple machines. They will collaborate with peers to develop problem solving, reasoning skills, and a better understanding of scientific concepts. Students interested in physics, engineering, or science in general will love this class!
2 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st and 3rd hour)

Make it Homemade: (grades 3-7) Students will learn the traditional way of making items such as jelly, soap, candles, and more. They will learn the history and origin of each item. They will also be making items that can be used at home.
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 1st and 4th Hour)

Math for Incoming 2nd Graders: (grade 1) Students will work on drills of the basic facts and review problem solving learned in first grade. Math games, puzzles, and manipulatives will be used.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Math for Incoming 3rd Graders: (grade 2) Students will work on drills of the basic facts and review problem solving learned in second grade. Math games, puzzles, and manipulatives will be used.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 2nd Hour)

Math for Incoming 4th Graders: (grade 3) Students will work on drills of basic facts and review problem solving learned in third grade. Emphasis will be placed on using manipulatives.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 2nd Hour)

Math for Incoming 5th Graders: (grade 4) Students will work on drills of basic facts and review problem solving learned in fourth grade. Emphasis will be placed on using manipulatives.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Nature Studies: (grades 2-4) Students travel outside the school building to study birds, plants, trees, insects, and water life.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 4th Hour)

Pre-First Grade: (grade 5K) This class is designed for students entering first grade. Focus is on activities that will prepare students for entering First Grade (i.e. reading, writing, math, art, and computers) **4 Hour Class.** \$3.00 Fee

Reading Success for Incoming 2nd Graders: (grade 1) This class is designed to help build reading strategies and skills for incoming 2nd graders. Students work with themed magazines packed with highly visual nonfiction articles and literary fiction. Students also work on vocabulary and word study, comprehension strategies, reading logs, and writing.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 3rd Hour)

Reading Success for Incoming 3rd Graders: (grade 2) This class is designed to help build reading strategies and skills for incoming 3rd graders. Students work with themed magazines packed with highly visual nonfiction articles and literary fiction. Students also work on vocabulary and word study, comprehension strategies, reading logs, and writing.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Reading Success for Incoming 4th Graders: (grade 3) This class is designed to help build reading strategies and skills for incoming 4th graders. Students work with themed magazines packed with highly visual nonfiction articles and literary fiction. Students also work on vocabulary and word study, comprehension strategies, reading logs, and writing.

1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 3rd Hour)

Students also work on vocabulary and word study, comprehension strategies, reading logs, and writing.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 2nd Hour)

Rocketry: (grades 3-7) Students will have “hands-on” experience building their own rockets. Rockets will be launched and recovered.
1 hour class. \$15.00 class fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Sewing 1: (5K-2) This beginning sewing class will have everyone using the sewing machine and sewing by hand. A variety of fun, unique sewing projects will be made. All materials are provided.
1 hour class. \$9.00 fee (Offered 1st and 2nd Hour)

Sewing for Fun 1: (grades 2-5) In this sewing lab, we will be making projects using the sewing machine and hand stitching. A variety of sewing projects will be sewn according to the students’ interests and age levels. All materials are supplied.
1 hour class. \$9.00 fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Space Science: (grades 1-3) This class is available for students interested in learning about “infinity and beyond”. Students will learn about planets, stars, and the sun in our universe using a variety of books and fun projects.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Spanish for Beginners: (grades 5K-5) Students will be introduced to Spanish vocabulary for beginners. Some of the topics that will be taught are: numbers, colors, animals, forms of greetings, cultural awareness, likes, dislikes and food items.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Hour)

Team Sports 1: (grades 1-4) Students will be offered a variety of organized team sports including soccer, baseball, kickball, dodgeball, and more.
1 hour class. No Fee (Offered 1st, 2nd & 4th Hour)

2018 Middle School Course Selections for Summer School

Computer Keyboarding: (Grades 5-7) Would you like more practice so you are able to use a keyboard and a computer with ease? If your answer is yes, then this is the course for you! Basic keyboarding skills will be taught.
1 hour class. No fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Cooking 2: (grades 5-7) This course will incorporate advanced cooking techniques and preparation of simple meals.
1 hour class. \$13.00 fee (Offered 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Hour)

Creative Clay: (grades 5 -7) Experiment and play with new ideas in this advanced class for clay hand-building. Students will be inspired and challenged to create a phone amplifier, spoon holder, toad/fairy/birdhouse, or any other ideas that we share and inspire each other with!
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 3rd Hour)

Discover Clay 2: (grades 5-7) Discover a love for clay with this beginner's class to clay hand-building. Students will create their own artist's signature stamp, experiment with different textures on clay pinch pots, and create a slab mug and a coiled bowl. (Advanced students are also welcome into this session to develop their own ideas and inspire beginner students)
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 2nd Hour)

Instrumental Music Lessons: (grades 5-11) Lessons will be offered to any student with an instrument and interested in learning to play. Lessons are provided once a week for 30 minutes. It is still possible to take three other classes. 30 minute lessons are arranged by the instructor.
30 Minute lesson. No Fee

Make it Homemade: (grades 5-7) Students will learn the traditional way of making items such as jelly, soap, candles, and more. They will learn the history and origin of each item. They will also be making items that can be used at home.
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 1st and 4th Hour)

Math for Incoming 6th Graders: (grade 5) Students will review basic facts and review problem solving learned in fifth grade. Emphasis will be placed on dividing and multiplying two digit factors, fractions, as well as measurement. Math games, puzzles, and technology will be used.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st Hour)

Math for Incoming 7 & 8th Graders: (grades 6 & 7) Students will review basic facts and review problem solving learned in Middle School. Emphasis will be placed on remedial skills needed to become more successful in all Middle School classes by use of technology.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 2nd Hour)

Reading Success for 5th, 6th, and 7th Graders: (grades 5,6 & 7) This class is designed to help build reading strategies and skills for middle schoolers. Students will work on vocabulary and word study, comprehension strategies, reading logs, and writing.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 4th Hour)

Rocketry: (grades 5-7) Students will have "hands-on" experience building their own rockets. Rockets will be launched and recovered.
1 hour class. \$15.00 fee (Offered 3rd and 4th Hour)

Strategy Games Creation: (grades 5-7) Combine your storytelling creativity with love of all things games! During our weeks together, we will be researching some board-based strategy games the best way there is: by playing them together. Then, we will create our own games and play them with and against each other. The games we create and study will be at varying levels of skill and difficulty, but everyone will have fun playing.
1 hour class. \$3.00 fee (Offered 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Hour)

Team Sports 2: (grades 5-7) Students will be offered a variety of organized team sports including soccer, baseball, kickball, dodgeball, and more.
1 hour class. No fee (Offered 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Hour)

Volleyball Fundamentals: Volleyball Fundamentals (Incoming freshmen) - This is a three hour rigorous course where students learn volleyball skills and systems used at higher levels. Expect to improve your Volleyball Skills if you take this course. Offered **Tuesday - Fridays** from June 11- **July 13th**. There will be no transportation the last week for this class.

2018 High School Course Selections for Summer School

AP U.S. History Prep: Incoming Juniors and Seniors

This course would help students enrolled in AP US History develop the skills needed to handle a college level workload, and gain a better understanding of time management. Students will develop the reading, writing, and historical thinking skills necessary to succeed at the collegiate level. This course will meet Tuesdays and Thursdays for 90 minutes

Personal Finance: Incoming 9 - 12 graders

This course is designed to teach students basic financial literacy in the modern world. Topics to be covered include: savings accounts, personal budgeting, checking accounts, credit cards & credit. College and career, insurance, and taxes. Students will learn how to develop the skills needed to manage money and adequately handle financial issues as they become adults. This course will run the same dates as the Elementary/Middle summer school.

AP English summer school description:

In an effort to maximize the AP English curriculum, incoming AP Language and Composition students will need to participate in the summer school program. All students will pick up their materials before the end of the school year and follow the prescribed assignments including, but not exclusive to: vocabulary development, reading a novel that will be used throughout the AP program, and complete four (4) college prep writing assignments. All work will have descriptive assignments, a sample of support, and the requirement to meet with the instructor at four checkpoints throughout the summer.

All assignments will be turned in by the assigned dates and grades will be reflected in the first quarter grading period.

This is a blended class, so students will meet at four mandatory sessions:

In addition, students will work independently on writing assignments and then meet with the

teacher during scheduled office hours to hone their writing craft.

2018 Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE):

This course is designed to reflect one of the three essential components of an agricultural education program. This specialized course is designed for those students aspiring to further develop their Supervised Agricultural Experience. The emphasis of this course is on hands-on learning and applying lessons to meet the needs of all students. Students in this course will work directly with the Agriscience Department. This summer independent study course includes putting together activity-based lessons relating to the SAEs of the enrolled students. Some of the areas that lessons will focus around will be: Dairy Production, Beef Production, Poultry Production, Sheep Production, Horticultural Science, Food Science / Agricultural Processing, Agricultural Education, Agriscience Applications, Agribusiness, Landscape Management, Crop Science, and many any other agricultural applications students wish to pursue.

This is an Independent Study class, the students will need to record a minimum of 90 hours during the summer with their projects in order meet the 90 hour requirement for a 1/2 credit in Agriculture. This class will also be graded on a pass/fail grade and not a regular letter grade. Please see **Joe Heinbach** with any questions and/or to sign up for the class.

AP Literature and Composition:

Students will need to participate in this summer school program to prepare them for the work we will do this school year. Students will pick up their materials prior to the end of this school year, including checking out required reading from the library. We will begin work on vocabulary and readings for our first thematic unit of existentialism, and various analytical writings. AP Lit students will be expected to complete all readings, dialectical journals, vocabulary assignments, analytical writing, and meet on the prescribed dates to advance their knowledge. All assignments must be submitted by the assigned dates and grades will be entered for first quarter. Students will work independently on reading and writing assignments , and meet with me during office hours for writer's / reader's conferences.
