New Holstein Huskies 2010 STATE SOCCER CHAMPS!

The lady husky soccer team's 2010 season came to a magical end on June 19. Kayla Bertram put in the winning goal just two minutes into the second overtime to give the Huskies their first Division 3 state championship at Uihlein Field in Milwaukee.

One week earlier, the Huskies advanced to state by defeating Winnebago Lutheran Academy by a score of 5-0, advancing them to the state tournament for the third time overall and the second time in three years. In the semifinals, the Huskies were matched up against Aquinas from LaCrosse. The Huskies jumped out to an early 2-0 lead and hung on to win 3-2, earning a berth in the championship game. On Saturday, New Holstein faced another private school, The Prairie School from Racine. This game did not start as lucky for the lady Huskies as they trailed 1-0 at halftime. However, in this game and throughout the season, this team never quit or gave up. Erin Diefenthaler proved this half way through the second half as she put in a Tracey Lisowe cross to tie the game up at one goal apiece. Neither team could score for the rest of regulation and through the first overtime.

In 2008, the scenario was much the same and the Huskies eventually lost in a shootout, but this time the results would be different. A few minutes into the second overtime, a Meghan Pasineau throw in went to Mariah Wipperman whose shot caromed right to Bertram, and she made sure the game would go on no longer.

This was a very special group of girls who were focused on what they needed to do. They had excellent chemistry and worked well together. When they were on the field they always believed they could win, and when you believe in yourself and your teammates anything is possible.

These girls are also great individuals. Most of them are excellent students, and many of them juggle full schedules and still manage to make soccer a priority. They are very dedicated and have put in a lot of time in the offseason. Many of them also take time out of their busy schedules to volunteer as coaches for the city teams and work with kids from kindergarten through age 13.

This was the first state championship for the girls' soccer program after finishing as runner up in 2008. It is the 6th overall for the school but the first since 1982. Congratulations also go to junior midfielder Meghan Pasineau who was named to the "Best of the Rest" for the All-State team, and to Coach Laabs who was voted "Small School Coach of the Year" by the Wisconsin Soccer Coaches Association.

School District of New Holstein Student Nondiscrimination Notice

It is the policy of the School District of New Holstein except as provided in State Statute 120.13, no person may be denied admission to any public school in this district or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, co-curricular, pupil services, recreational, or other program or activity because of the person's sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability or handicap as required by 118.13 Wisconsin Statutes. This policy also prohibits discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race and national origin), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

The district encourages informal resolution of complaints under this policy.

A formal complaint resolution procedure is available to address allegations of violations of the policy in the School District of New Holstein.

No Child Left Behind Parent Notification

The elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as No Child Left Behind of 2001, requires schools to notify all parents of children attending schools that qualify for Title I funding. New Holstein Elementary, Middle and High Schools are eligible for 2010-2011 Title I funds. The Federal Government uses Free and Reduced Lunch information to determine eligibility.

Federal law gives parents the right to request information about the qualifications of their child's teachers and para-professionals. All teachers in the New Holstein School District have at least a bachelor's degree and many have advanced degrees. If you want to see the state qualifications for your child's teacher, you may ask us or find it on the DPI website: www.dpi.state.wi.us/dpi/disis/tel/lisearch/html.

School Federal law also gives parents the right to know their child's level of achievement on state assessments. The School District of New Holstein will distribute student results at spring parent conferences or through a separate mailing, depending upon the receipt of the results from the testing company.

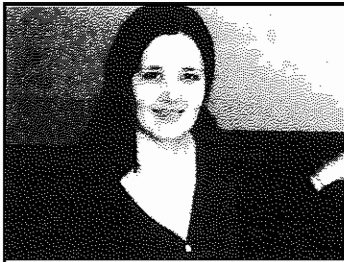
This month's Market Day order sheets are due back to the high school office by Friday, September 10th. Internet orders are due by 11:00 p.m. CST on Saturday, September 11th.

Care Square Child Care Opens at New Holstein Elementary

Beginning this school year, New Holstein Elementary School is opening a new child care center for students in 4K through grade 5. Care Square is an excellent resource for families of 4K students who need child care for the other half of the 4K day and for families who need after school child care. It is located in the Elementary School building.

The center will be open from 11:00-6:00 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and 7:30-6:30 on Wednesdays. The cost is \$16 for ½ day child care and \$28 for full day child care. After school child care is \$5 an hour.

There are openings still available for any family wishing to enroll their child in the Care Square Program. You may call the elementary office at 898-4208 to request a registration form.

Amanda Ziolkowski is the new Child Care Director. Amanda states, "I once heard a mother say her children were the most important things in her life. I feel it is essential for a child care center to revolve around this idea. This can be done through three main goals: a fun and safe environment, open communication, and respect for everyone involved. Student Records Notice

The School District of New Holstein maintains student records for each student attending school in the District. State and federal laws require that the maintenance of such records assure confidentiality. Accordingly, Wisconsin State Statute 118.125 and the following shall apply in the District:

1. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to inspect, review and obtain copies of the student's school records upon request in accordance with established District procedures. The District will respond to such requests without unnecessary delay. Copies of the District's student records procedures are available upon request during normal offices hours (8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) at New Holstein High School, Middle School, Elementary School and the School District Office.
2. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to seek amendment of the student's school educational records that he/she believes to be inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights. Complaints regarding the content of student records may be made in accordance with established District procedures. Copies of the District's procedures are available upon request as outlined above.
3. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to consent to the disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records, except to the extent that FERPA (and state laws) authorize disclosure without consent. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials determined to have legitimate educational interests, including safety interests, in the records. A "school official" is a person employed by the District who is required by the Department of Public Instruction to hold a license; a person employed by or working on behalf of the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor or support staff member (including health or medical staff and police-school liaison officers); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a specific task (such as an

attorney, auditor, medical consultant or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her tasks. A school official has a "legitimate educational interest" if the official needs to review a student record in order to fulfill his/her professional or District responsibility.

The District shall transfer a student's records to another school or school district without consent upon request in accordance with state law. District procedures outline the specific reasons for disclosure without consent and are available upon request as outlined above.

4. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student may request that the student's name, address and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters or institutions of higher education without prior written parental consent; and that the district must comply with such request.

5. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education for alleged District noncompliance with Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) requirements. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20202-4605.

Further, the District has designated the following student record information as directory data; student's name, parent/guardian's name, student's date of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received, and name of school most recently previously attended by the student.

This information may be disclosed to any person unless the adult student, or parent, legal guardian or guardian-ad-litem of a minor student informs the school within 14 days of receipt of this notice that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without prior consent of the adult student, parent, legal guardian or guardian-ad-litem. The District will not release directory data earlier than 14 days after the opening of school or receipt of this notice.

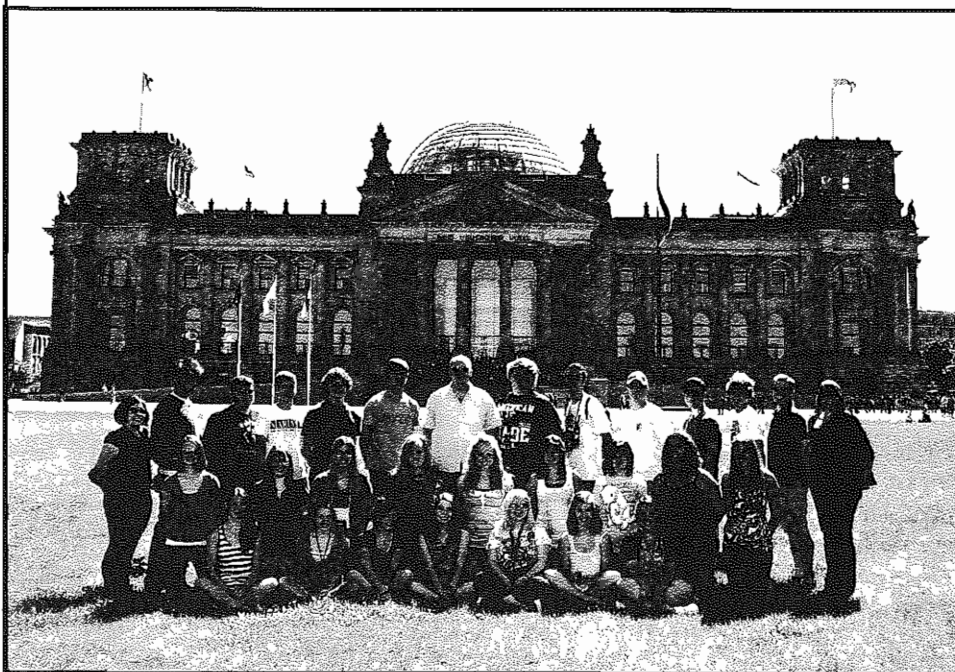

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF NEW HOLSTEIN Special Education Referral and Evaluation Procedures

Upon request, the New Holstein School District is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Beth Wiltman at (920) 898-4208, or by writing her at New Holstein Elementary School, 2226 Park Avenue New Holstein, WI 53061-1097

2010-11 Asbestos Notification

As a result of federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act -AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The School District of New Holstein has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as, the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the district shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees.

In keeping with this legislation, all buildings and support buildings owned or leased by the School District of New Holstein were inspected by EPA accredited

inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the school prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for handling the asbestos located within its buildings safely and responsibly.

Furthermore, the School District of New Holstein School is up to date on their 3-Year Re-inspection required by AHERA. Our district buildings, where asbestos-containing materials were found, are under repair, removal and Operations and Maintenance.

This past year the School District of New Holstein conducted the following with respect to its asbestos containing building materials:

**Implemented our Operations and Maintenance Program*

Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called "surveillance") every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected three years after a management plan is in effect. MacNeil Environmental, Inc will accomplish this under contract.

Short-term workers (outside contractors - i.e., telephone repair workers, electricians and exterminators) must be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the lead maintenance person before commencing work to be given this information.

The School District of New Holstein School has a list of the location(s); type(s) of asbestos containing materials found in that school building and a description and timetable for their proper management. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review in the school office.

Equal Access Notice
