WI School-Based Mental Health Grant

- Submitted to the Department of Public Instruction on May 1st
- On July 11th received full amount we asked for of \$39,125 for the 2019-2020 school year and \$39,125 for 2020-2021.
- Main components of the Grant:
 - b.e.s.t. Screener for ALL students 4K-12
 - Social Emotional Learning Curriculum for the Elementary in Year 1 and the middle school in Year 2
 - Trained Trainer for Sources of Strength and implement (SOS) in the middle school and high school
 - Necessary staff literacy and education.


b.e.s.t. Screener


- Created by Dr. Hartwig Marshfield Clinic
- The b.e.s.t. screener stands for Behavior Emotional Social Traits screener.
- New Holstein Elementary piloted the b.e.s.t. screener in Spring of 2019 for only Kindergarten and First Grade.
- Screening all students will help staff better understand the individual needs of our students and will provide clear direction and tools on how to meet individual student needs.
- With funding from the Grant ALL students 4K-12 will be screened.

b.e.s.t. Screener

- Completed by the teacher
- Test window is in November and again in Spring
- There are 26 items on the screener that the teacher rates on a Likert scale of 1 to 6
- Takes 3-5 minutes per student to complete the screener
- Results provide a great visual for teachers and provides a list of interventions
- A teleconference with Dr. Hartwig is scheduled with the teachers and other staff
