Officer Kurtis Stephany was an original member of our Teaming for a Brighter Tomorrow team. The last few years he has spent his time patrolling the streets of New Holstein and as of January 1 he has returned to his position as a School Resource Officer in the NH School District. We are glad to have him back as an active member in our school community.

High School Highlights

The High School is starting a Social Emotional Learning curriculum for all students. During our opening inservice in late August, all teachers and staff were trained on the SOS model. Then, on September 23rd, thirty eight students and nine staff members were trained on the eight sources of strength. Throughout the year, this group will provide 3-4 campaigns highlighting elements of the sources. The eight sources of strength are family support, positive friends, mentors, health activities, generosity, spirituality, medical access, and mental health. This work is a great compliment to our Allies In Mental Health Education initiative started last year.

P.A.R.T.Y. (Prevent Alcohol and Risk Related Trauma in Youth) at the PAC was attended by all sophomores. Messaging is about making informed decisions regarding risk taking behaviors

Elementary Highlights

The elementary school has used some of our funds for our P.A.W.S. (Practice, Act, Welcome, Safety) which is part of our positive behavior intervention support (PBIS) program. If our students are caught doing something extra positive, welcoming, respectful or safe, they can earn a PAWS ticket. Students can then collect the tickets and 'buy' items with them. We have used some funds to replenish PAWS store items. Our PBIS committee is now meeting to review our PBIS program and will be planning what to do with our remaining funds.

We have also used some of the money for our Winter Carnival that was held, Friday, January 17th. It was a wonderful event that was well attended even though the snow that evening made traveling a little difficult. The PTO organized the event. We had our gym set up with around 12 different games that students could play. We also had a huge bouncy slide for students to enjoy. Thank you all for the donations that enrich our students' school experience.



Middle School Highlight

Quarterly, eighth grade students are presented with an evidence based suicide awareness and prevention lesson called Mindwise, previously Sign of Suicide (funded by Teaming for a Brighter Tomorrow). As part of the lesson students take the Adolescent Brief Screen for Depression. Second quarter, a student was identified as likely to have depression and for the first time had mentioned thoughts of suicide. The student and family utilized SFAP and were seen by a therapist that same evening.

Through collaboration between school staff and SFAP, the therapist was able to determine best care and referred the student to a specialist whom would be able to work with them long term.
