## School District of New Holstein Title I Parent Notification

The elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as No Child Left Behind of 2001, requires schools to notify all parents of children attending schools that qualify for Title I funding. New Holstein Elementary and Middle Schools are eligible for Title I funds. The Federal Government uses Free and Reduced Lunch information to determine eligibility.

Federal law gives parents the right to request information about the qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals. All teachers in the New Holstein School District have at least a bachelor's degree and many have advanced degrees. School Federal law also gives parents the right to know their child's level of achievement on state assessments. The School District of New Holstein will distribute student results at spring parent conferences or through a separate mailing, depending upon the receipt of the results from the testing company.
