Each year there are many area, state, and national scholarships available to seniors who plan to attend colleges or technical colleges. This booklet contains information on all such scholarships that were available in the 2017-2018 school year. The information and deadline dates are from last year, but for the most part these scholarships do not vary much from year to year.

If you feel you are eligible for certain scholarships, check in the guidance office about a month before the deadline date to obtain application information. Some scholarship information is available on line as well. You should also listen for scholarship announcements because it's very likely there will be new scholarships that are not listed in this booklet. Check the activity bulletin board or the high school web page each day if you don't hear announcements. The announcements are typed and posted each day. Also, you should on a weekly basis, check the scholarship posting on the guidance office window and the scholarship bin in the guidance office.

Sometimes students do not apply, thinking that they don't have a chance. As a rule, you should apply for any scholarships for which you are eligible. Good luck in your search for scholarship aid.

## **READY, SET, APPLY! SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS**

### **Step One: First Impressions:**

- You are painting a picture of yourself with words.
- The appearance of your application will be the first thing judged about your application.
- Consider a sleeve/folder to “house” your application if allowed.
- Your first page should be a “cover” page including your name, the name of the scholarship and the date.
- Your application should be typed.
- Your application should be neat and clean.
- The application is viewed as “a whole.” The message must be complete and consistent.
- Unsuccessful applications are laundry lists of credentials.
- Winning applications show the person “behind” the application.

### **Step Two: The Application Components:**

- Personal Data
- Extracurricular Listing
- Community/Volunteer Experiences
- Work Experiences
- Essays/Personal Statements
- Letters of Recommendation

### **Step Three: The Application Process:**

- Read the application completely before you begin.
- Print off a copy if at all possible and make several copies to use as rough drafts.
- Have the following documents completed and ready for reference:
  - A list of your top ten personal qualities
  - Record of activities, achievements, events, or experiences that highlight that quality
  - Student resume
  - Extracurricular activity list
  - Community and volunteer activities
  - Work experience

#### **Step Four: Completing the Application:**

- Answer the questions that are asked.
- Do not leave spaces blank.
- For very short answers, provide as much detail as possible.
- If the answer is lengthy, state “See attached documents.”
- Do not begin in the space provided, but attach a new sheet. Label the document: Ex: Question 3.
- Trim the fat and get to the meat of the information.
- For compact spaces:
  - Separate information with semicolons and use parentheses to mention important details: Ex: Service Club (VP); School newspaper (sports editor)

#### **Step Five: Winning Essays:**

- “Show,” do not just “tell.”
- Keep things personal.
- Use effective organization – essays have three parts:
  - Introduction (the hook)
  - Body - engage the reader . . . tell the story
  - Conclusion: Restate and summarize but also comment on your personal qualities that extend the point (by working in a homeless shelter, I witnessed the needs for medical and psychological care)
- Make every sentence count.
- Make your essays unique and memorable.
- Honing your essay – The Four R’s – review, re-evaluate, reassess, read out loud.

#### **SUMMARY:**

- Look for instances in which you have exhibited outstanding personal qualities.
- Make a point of communicating these personal qualities in the scholarship.

Amerequip College Scholarship (\$1,000)

A Kiel, New Holstein, or Little Chute senior who will attend a technical college, college, or university will receive this award. Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, enroll in manufacturing, engineering, or business-related fields, and be involved in school and community activities.

American Cancer Society Scholarship (\$1,000)

Seniors who are cancer survivors and who plan to attend two- or four-year universities or technical colleges are eligible.

Due: March 15

American Legion Americanism and Government Scholarship (\$250 - \$500)

Any 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, or 12<sup>th</sup> grade student can participate in this on-line test program which is available the first two weeks in April. Students are tested on their knowledge of United States, Wisconsin, and County governments, the Constitution, and flag etiquette.
